A tip for parents

A helpful tip that I would provide to parents would be to always support and foster your child's love of learning. I would advise them to talk, listen, and expose their children to as many rich experiences as possible. Get them to wonder, to question, and to explain. Be involved and present when you are with them. You will set your child up for success if you give them this positive modeling and guidance.
